Our Jani McDonald day group decided to make these dolls for a Charlotte Cramer mission trip to Honduras. It was to be a one-time only project, but as you can see, our Lord has not told us to stop yet. It has been our purpose to give to missionaries a simple tool to use to teach the story of Jesus.
